Corporate Calendar Policies

Cancellation Policy

New York Cares must receive notice of a project cancellation no later than 10 business days prior to the confirmed project start date. Volunteer slots and project bank slots will be forfeited for any project that is cancelled less than 10 business days prior to the confirmed project date.

Inclement Weather Policy

New York Cares works with our partners to ensure a safe and impactful volunteer project. Projects may be rescheduled due to severe weather one time and within four weeks of the original project date. Rescheduling dates are dependent upon the partner agency's availability.

Severe weather is defined by the following:

- Heavy rain fall and flooding
- Damaging winds
- Hail
- Thunderstorms
- Lightning

Environmental Stewardship projects will move forward in the event of light rain. Project cancellations at the request of the corporate partner due to light rain cannot be rescheduled and are subject to our cancellation policy.

If there is a threat of inclement weather, please speak with your New York Cares representative. Projects are not considered eligible to be rained-out until 1-2 business hours prior to the project date.

Low Recruitment Policy

New York Cares understands cancellations may come as a disappointment to our partners and community who are looking forward to contributing their time and skills to our initiatives. When our corporate partners are unable to secure the necessary number of volunteers to ensure the successful execution of the project, it becomes New York Cares' responsibility to make difficult decisions. We have carefully assessed the situation and weighed available options. Without enough volunteers, we will not be able to deliver the high-quality experience and impact that we envisioned for the project. New York Cares will strategize suggestions for improving recruitment numbers. If recruitment numbers do not meet the minimum requirement within 10 business days of project start, New York Cares will begin implementing plans cancellation procedures and corporate partner will forfeit their volunteer slots.

Harassment Policy

New York Cares expects all volunteers to be respectful of staff members, clients, and each other while participating on a project. We ask volunteers to refrain from the following:

- Discriminatory or racist statements or behaviors.
- Sexual harassment, for example, jokes, innuendos, insults, sexist remarks, the display of derogatory or pornographic pictures, leering, touching, or kissing.
- The use of any alcohol or illegal drugs.
- Any unlawful or inappropriate activity.

Coat Sorting Policy

New York Cares greatly values the dedication of our volunteers and the impact you make on our community. At times, we may need to cancel or reschedule volunteer projects due to factors outside of our control. For example, coat sorting projects rely on having an abundance of coats in our possession. In the event we run into a coat shortage or face other unforeseen circumstances, this policy outlines the procedures and expectations for Coat Sorting Project cancellations and rescheduling procedures.

1. Cancellation and Rescheduling Procedures

- A. Notification: New York Cares will make every effort to notify volunteers of project cancellations and rescheduling opportunities as early as possible. We understand that your time is valuable and strive to minimize disruptions to your commitment. We will communicate a week prior to the shift date if the need arises for cancellation due to a shortage in coat collecting.

2. Rescheduling Projects

- A. Rescheduling: When possible, New York Cares will attempt to reschedule projects to an alternative date and time that is convenient for registered volunteers and the New York Cares staff. We appreciate your flexibility in accommodating these changes.

Thank you for your commitment to New York Cares and for your understanding of our volunteer project cancellation and rescheduling policy. You are helping us build a more equitable NYC, and we look forward to your continued support.

Donations

We offer a mutually beneficial partnership with year-round engagement opportunities. We believe our corporate partners are critical stakeholders in equity and social change. When you invest in our work, your donation will have a citywide impact.
