The City We Know We Can Be

Our 37th year was defined by growth and renewed appreciation for the volunteers who made it possible. We relaunched youth and family-friendly volunteer opportunities, reimagined innovative programs like Mad Scientists, and expanded in-person community-building events across cornerstone initiatives like the Coat Drive, Winter Wishes, Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA), and SAT Prep.

Igniting a Love for Science

Our Mad Scientists program brought STEM learning to life for 3rd–5th graders through hands-on experiments in engineering, biology, geology, and chemistry. In 2024, we expanded to **PS 20 Anna Silver** and **PS 135 Sheldon A. Brookner**, where volunteers led interactive sessions that sparked curiosity and ignited a lasting love of science.

Shaping Tomorrow’s Leaders

We welcomed the return of youth and teen-friendly volunteer opportunities, creating pathways for New Yorkers ages 5–17 to serve their communities, explore the city, build leadership skills, and make meaningful impact.

A standout example is our partnership with the **Stanley M. Isaacs Neighborhood Center**, where youth volunteers and students from the **Brooklyn STEAM Center** hosted lively Senior Proms for older adults. Through music, dancing, crafts, and conversation, generations came together to create a truly special day.

As we expand our youth-friendly project offerings, we’re excited to see these opportunities—and young changemakers—continue to grow.

Serving Those Who Served

Mission: VetCheck is dedicated to supporting veterans in their transition back to civilian life, who often face challenges like limited access to public services, housing, mental health support, and employment assistance.

In 2024, we exceeded our goal of 11,500 calls, reaching over 16,000 veterans to ensure they received the resources and support they’ve earned. We also expanded our outreach beyond New York City to help connect veterans across the country with local services.

Thanks to our partnership with the **NYC Department of Veterans’ Services** and additional support from **New York Health Foundation** and **New York City Council**, Mission: VetCheck volunteers offer critical outreach, trusted information, and heartfelt connections—creating opportunities to thank our veterans through meaningful action.

Warming Up with the Best

Our **36th Annual Coat Drive** continued its tradition of powerful partnerships and high-impact events, collecting coats at some of NYC's most iconic venues. In collaboration with **Dimension20** and their sold-out event, **Gauntlet at the Garden** held at MSG, we collected 1,514 coats. The **Amazin' Mets** Coat Drive brought in 2,509 coats, followed by 393 at the **New York Islanders** game, 105 during the **Nets vs. Knicks** matchup, and an additional 700 from our corporate partner **BSE Global**.

Behind the scenes, logistics partners made the drive possible: **Piece of Cake Moving & Storage** provided 6,000 boxes and essential transportation support, while **UPS** managed pickups and mobilized thousands of coats across the city.

Together, these partnerships helped warm over 48,000 New Yorkers—one coat at a time.

Partnering with Purpose

Through our partnership with the **Chinese-American Planning Council (CPC)**, we expanded our impact across their Brooklyn, Manhattan, and Queens sites. In Queens, we provided backpacks filled with school supplies as part of our **Stand with Students** campaign, granted **Winter Wishes** to students at PS 20 Q - John Bowne (including those with special needs), assembled supply kits for seniors, and distributed hundreds of coats at CPC's Lunar New Year celebration in Sunset Park.

Looking ahead, we'll be increasing our support through coat distributions, baby essentials, food pantry aid, and intergenerational programs that foster connection between older adults and teens.

Partnering with Purpose (cont'd)

Ahead of the 2024 election, our partnership with **NYC Votes** mobilized volunteers to educate and engage voters through neighborhood canvassing, phone calls, and in-person registration at community events and transit hubs. In collaboration with the **League of Women Voters of NYC**, we launched a postcard campaign, sending handwritten voting reminders to historically low-turnout areas with key election details. These efforts empowered volunteers to strengthen civic participation and help build a more informed, engaged electorate.

We also partnered with **Team TLC** to welcome newly arrived migrants and refugees into our city. Through their Little Shop of

Kindness, newcomers received free clothing and necessities in a dignified, supportive environment—thanks to the dedication of our volunteers, including youth participating in our family-friendly service projects.

Additionally, our collaboration with **NYC Aging** connected volunteers with homebound older adults through a citywide phone-banking initiative. These conversations not only provided companionship, but also gathered valuable insights to help identify needs and connect seniors to critical services. The data collected will inform future strategies for aging support citywide—strengthening community care and ensuring older adults are heard and supported as we work toward a more inclusive, responsive New York City.

Leaping into an Extra Day of Care

February 29 only comes around once every Leap Year—but with our **Extra Day of Care** campaign, we proved that even one day can make a meaningful difference. To help bring NYC closer to the City We Know We Can Be, we encouraged New Yorkers to turn their Leap Year into a day of service. Created in partnership with the Dalton Agency, the campaign asked a simple, powerful question: “What would you do with an extra day?”

Featuring our refreshed brand, bold new language, and updated logo, the campaign reached audiences across the city and beyond. With donated placements valued at over \$160,000—including social media posts, digital banners, iHeartRadio spots, and billboards in Times Square—Extra Day of Care generated more than 13.1 million media impressions. Not only did the campaign raise visibility for New York Cares, it inspired action—mobilizing volunteers and donors to use their time to make a tangible impact across the five boroughs.

Learning Together, Leading Together

We continue to expand our volunteer and Team Leader community, strengthening The City We Know We Can Be. In 2024, we reintroduced Team Leader info sessions and launched the Team Leader Support Squad to provide ongoing mentorship and guidance. A major milestone was our annual **Team Leader Conference**, where we brought the Team Leader community together for inspiration and learning, and honored an exemplary volunteer with the Team Leader of the Year Award. To further equip Team Leaders, we held three specialized workshops that tackled problem-solving, communication, and volunteer engagement. Our Team Leaders drive positive impacts in our communities, and it’s an honor to empower them.
